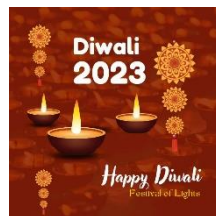
Dear Families,

Therefore, the lights in the classrooms are switched off, where possible, as well as laptops, screens, boards and printers. Now more than ever, we need to work together and protect our fragile planet. Saving energy can help reduce our Carbon footprint and tackle Climate Crisis. Year 6 RAF Museum – Wartime Classroom Workshops - 30th October 2023

As part of our World War II topic, Year 6 students went on a trip to participate in a workshop that allowed them to experience what school was like in the 1940s. The children enjoyed sitting at traditional desks, learning from a chalkboard, and using an ink pen and inkwell to record their learning.

During the workshop, the children learned about the challenges of schooling during the Blitz, including the shortage of resources such as books. They also learned about how children protected themselves under their desks during air raids and how they were prepared for evacuation to travel to the safety of the countryside.

School Lunches and Packed Lunches.

It is great to see so many families choosing to take up the free school meal option this year, thanks to the Mayor's funding. As the days get colder, a warm meal at lunch time is great for all children. Our school lunches have a range to choose from, including vegetarian, halal and non-halal. There is always a good selection at the salad bar too.

Year 5 trip to the Science Museum

On the 16th of October, Year 5 visited the Science Museum as part of their 'Space' topic. Year 5 pupils had the opportunity to watch the documentary 'A Beautiful Planet' on an IMAX screen and tour the Space gallery. They also participated in a Rocket workshop, where they learnt about forces and how objects move forwards.

Year 3 trip to Epping Forest

On Wednesday 1st November, our Year 3 pupils embarked on an exciting journey to Epping Forest. During this trip the children were able to immerse themselves into the Stone Age world and could experience several different aspects of Stone Age life. They had an opportunity to learn survival skills such as creating fire using flint stones and cotton wool. They also were able to unleash their creativity skills to create cave paintings using charcoal and chalk. The adventure continued as the children marched through the enchanted forest through the stream and over huge tree trunks. Deep within the forest the children constructed their very own Stone Age shelters using natural resources around them. This activity fostered great teamwork and communication between all the children and encouraged problem solving and perseverance when faced with challenges. Messages from the school office

School Meals– Although all primary school aged children are entitled to free school meals, it is still essential that children stick with either school dinners or packed lunches.
