We have lots to celebrate and share with you in this issue, as everyone at Colindale has been working hard and enjoying learning.

There have been some educational visits to the Verulamium and Chicken Shed Theatre; Reception have been learning to cross the road safely; parents have been into school to see more open lessons; staff attended annual PREVENT training; plus, lots more!

School Improvement Visit:

Each term our LNI (Learning Network Inspector) from Barnet conducts a School Effectiveness Visit (SEV) to support and challenge the school in terms of school improvement and development. Our SEV visit this term had a focus on adaptive teaching in maths – an area of focus from the Ofsted report (July 2023)

Here are some of the comments from the recent visit:

- Teachers consistently demonstrated secure subject knowledge and lessons were clearly structured.
- There is a calm, purposeful and inclusive atmosphere throughout the school. Pupils are keen to talk about their learning and are polite and respectful in their interactions with both adults and their peers. Behaviour for learning in the classroom is strong. Adults are positive role models and have established numerous harmonious relationships with pupils.
- Leaders are unequivocally ambitious for pupils.

Attendance

A recent government report regarding attendance in schools stated, 'Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for pupils to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extra-curricular opportunities and pastoral care.'

Parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure their child/dren get a full-time education.

School is open for pupils for 190 days a year - and pupils are expected to attend all of these days. Holidays / days off are not permitted. (With exception to illness)

190 school days out of a whole year (365 days) = 52% of the year.

This means that there are 175 days (48%) of the rest of the year to take holidays / plan days out etc.

Staff training - PREVENT

Home Time Collection

Please ensure your child is picked up on time at <u>3.15pm at the correct collection point</u>. If your child is in Years 3-6, please do not take your child from the line before they reach the collection point. Years 3 and 4 must be collected from the courts and Years 5 and 6 from the field.

If you are delayed in picking up your child at the end of the day, please give the office a call in the first instance. If somebody else is picking up your child, you must let the teacher know in the morning at drop off or call the school office and give the name of the person collecting your child. No child will be released if we are not informed. Late collections will be monitored.

Nut Free School

We are a 'Nut Free School'. Items which contain nuts are not permitted in packed lunches or in snacks given to pupils at the end of the day, this includes chocolate spread such as Nutella. We have pupils and staff with severe nut allergies. Please help keep our pupils and staff safe and check the ingredients of food brought in.



KS2 Breaktime Snacks Reminder:

We actively encourage children in KS2 to bring in a mid-morning snack to be eaten at breaktime. This must be in line with our school food policy and **only be fruit or vegetables**. No crisps / crackers / cereal bars etc. Also, please be reminded that we are a **nut-free school**.







Uniform reminder:

We have a uniform at Colindale school to unite us. We believe that a uniform looks smart, wears well, supports good behaviour and contributes to a sense of belonging to our school. Our policy states that children must wear black, plain school shoes. They can also wear plain black trainers – no coloured logo please.

<u>Our policy does not allow black boots</u> – this is for health and safety reasons in school. The children cannot sit comfortably on the carpet with them; some boots do not have enough grip or protection and are simply for fashion. Even in this colder weather, socks / tights and shoes are perfectly fine for all children. Black school shoes are readily available in most supermarkets at very reasonable prices.

Interfaith Week

Each year across the UK an Interfaith Week is held. It's an opportunity for people to learn about different faiths and cultures. We also had visitors from different faiths. Rabbi Jackie visited Y1 and Y3. She retold the story of Hanukkah to our Y1 pupils and talked about why it is an important time for Jewish people. She spoke her role as a Rabbi and life as a Jewish person to Y3. She shared many objects which she uses in her everyday life and in her role. Y3 had lots of well thought-out questions for her.

Father Duckett visited Y2 and spoke about inspirational people in Christianity. They learnt about lots of saints who are special to Christian people and what they had done to inspire. He also explained that he was names after a saint. Some of the children explained who they were named after.

Year 4 were visited by Venerable Jue Qian. She spoke to Y4 about why Buddha is an important person to Buddhists. She also explained about her role at the Buddhist temple. She explained why meditating and chanting is an important part of her daily life.

Year 1 Open Lesson in Handwriting



On Monday 4th December, Year 1 invited their parents to come and join in a handwriting lesson. Parents and children warmed up by doing some exercises with their hands and arms

These are some of the exercises you can do at home:



lock your fingers together and stretch



slowly make circles
with your wrists one
way and then another

sit on your bottom and push down on your hands

Thumb holds pencil.

First finger rests on top of the pencil.
 Pencil rests against third finger.

They also learnt about the importance of sitting correctly at a table; having the correct pencil grip; and tilting the paper the correct way. These are the steps they followed:

- 1. Feet flat on the floor
- 2. Sit up straight
- 3. Elbows resting on your desk
- 4. Hold your book still, with your non-writing hand
- 4. Neck and shoulders relaxed.
- 5. Paper tilted to the left (if right-handed)
- 6. Paper tilted to the right (if left-handed)

Crunchy Minty Green Pea Salad







150 g	Baby spinach roughly chopped
75 g	Mint sauce

750 g	Fine green beans
300 g	Peas
85 g	Spring onions finely sliced

Instructions

- Cook the green beans in plenty of boiling water until tender.
- Immediately drain and plunge the beans into iced water with the cold tap running until the beans are completely cold. Drain well.
- Combine all the ingredients to serve.
