#### <u>Year 5 – Chickenshed Theatre trip</u>

Year 5 had the pleasure of watching 'The Toymaker's Child' which is a wonderful retelling of the classic Pinocchio story at the Chickenshed Theatre. The children were fascinated by the beautifully designed sets and the captivating cast of colourful characters! The children then followed up by writing a theatre review in English lessons.







### Year 4 Trip to Verulamium

On the 5th of December, year 4 children went on an educational trip to Verulamium Museum in St Albans as part of our Autumn history topic, The Romans. The day was dedicated to immersing themselves in the rich history of the Roman civilization. The children explored Roman ruins and artefacts within the museum grounds, participating in a workshop that provided hands-on experience with Roman everyday objects. Whilst exploring the grounds, the children got to see parts of the Roman wall built by the Romans to defend the city of Verulamium from enemies. They also visited the Hypocaust, an ancient underfloor heating system which is a marvel of Roman engineering and an excellent example of the first indoor heating systems installed in Britain! "It's unbelievable that Romans had underfloor heating like we have in our school," Noha from 4G remarked. The children were impressed by the whole experience of the trip, following the steps of the Romans. A special thank you to all the parents that came along, the visit would not have been possible without you!



# **Road Safety Week in Reception**

Reception have been learning about road safety and how to cross the road safely by always remembering to 'stop', 'look', 'listen', and 'think' before crossing.

The children were very excited to go on a road safety walk. Before going on their adventure, they put on their high visibility jackets to make sure they could be seen.

The roads around the school were quite busy, but they all remembered to follow the road safety rules by staying close to the wall while walking along the pavement, waiting at the kerb before crossing the road and looking left and right. They practiced crossing the main road at the pelican crossing, making sure they waited for the Green Man light before crossing.

### Year 4 - Stop Animation (English, Computing, Design)

In Year 4, the children get the opportunity to write a fantasy story, which they then turn into a playscript, alongside this they build scenes and characters from plasticine, it's a proper project. Once this is done, they are fortunate enough to work with professional visual artist, Reza Ben Gajra, who comes in and spends a day with each class. He brings with him all manner of technology to help turn the children's stories into stop animation films. It takes great patience, resilience, and creativity to produce the desired effect but having watched the Year 4 children working with Reza I am sure the final product will be worth it. Reza has been very impressed, not only by the children's creativity but also the way they have thrown themselves positively into a task that does not give instant gratification. In fact, the children will need to wait into the new year to see their finished film as once the filming is done Reza takes the images that have been taken and edits the films to include sound effects etc. We look forward to inviting you to the 'Premier' of the films in January/February time.







#### Winter Fayre

The annual Winter Fayre was another successful PSA event. Children from every year group made items to sell. There were stalls selling calendars, decorations, delicious gingerbread men, photo and picture frames, sweet treats and much, much more. 




S4K Afterschool Clubs are an extension of the school day, aimed at supporting working parents, but to also give children the chance to enjoy physical and mental well-being activities. Every day is different, supported by S4K coaches teaching sports and fun physical games to children, mixed with activities designed to help children relax and unwind. For all children from **Reception - Yr6**.

Afterschool Club: 3:30 - 4:30pm - £7.50 - This club includes I hour of sports. Pick-up time is 4:30pm.

Home Club: 3:30 - 4:30pm - £15 - If you would like your child to stay later than 4:30, then you need to book our Home Club option. This club includes 1 hour of sports, snack time and then free play time. Pick-up time is between **5-6pm**.
