RIDING FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES. Our children with physical disabilities, learning difficulties and autism have been benefitting from horse riding for the disabled for a long time

now. We visit Penniwells Stables in Edgware every Thursday, taking children in our minibus, which is adapted to take wheelchairs safely. Being on a horse is great physical and mental therapy, helping our children to be in control and be able to move in a way that takes them out of their wheelchair and makes them feel 'on top of the world'. It is also very calming activity for children with autism.

Unfortunately, due to cuts, we are no longer able to subsidise this activity from our school budget and have had to do some fundraising. Year 4 raised over £200 when they sang carols at Bang Bang Oriental

Foodhall in December. A big thank you to Year 4, they are obviously very good singers! This will meet the cost of the Spring Term. We are trying to find other ways of raising money so if you know of any, or are willing to make a donation, please speak to Ms Napthine. (Assistant Headteacher)
