During June, the pupils in Year 1 and some in Year 2 took their Phonics check. This is a test during which pupils need to read 40 words. The words are made up of the phonics that the children have been learning all year. There are a mixture of real words and nonsense words such as 'vlop'. The pupils have worked hard all year (and continue to work hard) to make progress in their learning and to achieve well. During the checks we were all very proud of how the pupils conducted themselves; they were focussed and excited. The teachers commented on how mature and well behaved the pupils were during this time.

Having worked closely with them and their teachers this year, it is clear to see how they have all progressed from the start of the year. They love learning phonics and the impact of their hard work can be seen across their reading and writing.
