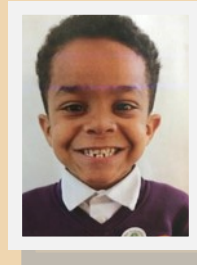


We have had a very busy month at Colindale Primary School and hope you enjoy reading all about it in this newsletter.

Year 5's Groovy Greeks Workshop: Earlier on this month, Year 5 took part in a workshop at school as part of our learning about the Ancient Greece. The day consisted of fun-filled activities, practical learning, storytelling and drama.

The day began with the children being instructed that they were now residents of Athens and they had to be arranged into groups of whom was the most important in Ancient Greek times – boys, then girls, then visitors to Athens and finally slaves. The children found this quite amusing! They were



then told the story of how their day would begin. 'It is 490 BC and Persia had invaded Greece. The armies were pushing toward the city-state of Athens and the Persians had reached Marathon a few miles away. The Athenians stood 10,000 strong to face the invaders, but would it be enough?' The tension was mounting!

For the next activity, the children were then allocated typical roles found in the Athenian Agora (marketplace) at the time, such as wax tablet makers, pottery painters, fresco painters and jewellers. They were able to make small pieces of arts and crafts at various activity tables.



As the children worked, news and rumours swirled through the Agora about the battle. Could the Persians be defeated?

Was Athens safe? They had great fun gossiping, spreading rumours and giving offerings to the Greek Gods in the hope of good fortune.

During the afternoon the children were split into different groups – slaves, dancers, soldiers and ac-

tors and they had some time to learn their parts for their dramas. When we all came back together, a brave soldier (Aydin 5D) was chosen and he acted out that he had run all the way from Marathon to tell the Athenians that the battle of Marathon had been won and the Persians were now defeated. The celebrations could begin! A Greek feast took place where the children sampled feta cheese, bread, olives, dates and honey cake. They even had a goblet of wine (blackcurrant cordial!) to toast the brave soldiers. They were then entertained by a dance, a formation march by the soldiers and two plays – one about a Greek Myth and the other about a fable by Aesop. The whole day was an amazing experience where the children were able to learn about many aspects of the Ancient Greeks in a fun and immersive way. *Ms. Dray (Year 5 teacher)*
