On Wednesday 19th of September the children in year 3 thoroughly enjoyed their trip to the **Natural History Museum.** They had the opportunity to look closely at prehistoric rocks and minerals and take part in a Dino Investigation led by the Museum. During the investigation, the children played the role of Palaeontologists. First they identified whether objects were fossils or not based on their properties. Then they were tasked to uncover a fossil of a



dinosaur's skull. The children then had to measure the length of the skull to find out which type of dinosaur it belonged to. By observing the teeth, they were also able to discover whether the dinosaur was a herbivore or a carnivore. The children were really excited to find out that their fossils belonged to either an Allosaurus or
