On Wednesday 25th September, Year 3 had the opportunity to visit the Natural History

MUSEUM as part of our first exciting topic, The Prehistoric Ages. We roamed the museum enthusiastically like true explorers and were able to see fossils and skeletons from some of the earliest life on Earth, including dinosaurs. *"What I liked the most, was seeing and learning about the dinosaurs!"* Zahra said. We also learned about what a volcano is and how it erupts, why earthquakes happen and admired all the different types of rocks. *"I enjoyed looking at the Obsidian rock, the Diamonds, the Quartz and all the other types of*

Finally, we took part in a workshop called "Dino Scene Investigation", where we were involved in our own fossil dig, like palaeontologists uncovering mystery specimens from excavation boxes. We observed and drew the bone structure of what we had found to discover the species our fossil came from. Year 6 visited the RAF museum on Tue 17th September. Each class attended a workshop about how our local area has changed since the airfield was established in 1912. Children looked at maps from 1912, 1970 and the present day and were able to locate their school and see how the area had developed over the last 100 years. They also had the chance to dress up in period uniform and learn how the improvements in technology and materials meant that today's RAF pilots and engineers have a much warmer and more comfortable working environment.
