### **Year 5 trip to the Science Museum**

On the 26th of September, Year 5 visited the Science Museum as part of the 'Space' topic. Year 5 pupils had the opportunity to watch the documentary 'A Beautiful Planet' on an IMAX screen and tour the Space gallery.

## Little Rainbows first days in school

To help with their settling in we have been reading Colour Monster by Anna Llenas, a book about feelings. We have focused on how the children might be feeling, such as being sad when parents are away or feeling happy when they are playing.

Also the children have been learning our nursery routine, washing their hands, hanging their coats, sharing and turn taking with their peers and using the resources appropriately.

They have also enjoyed digging in the sandpit, pouring and emptying containers in the water tray, modelling in play-dough, 'cooking' in the mud kitchen and exploring the outdoor equipment. They have also had fun sorting colours, painting, drawing and playing with cars.
