#### Attendance message:

It is incredibly important that your child attends school every day - unless they are unwell. Please note that leave of absence will not be granted during school time, except in exceptional circumstances. Your child/ren only attend school for 190 days a year, out of 365, therefore we expect families to not book holidays, make appointments etc during this time. Absence from school has both a negative academic impact and a social impact on your child.
