












Year 1 Traditional Tales Home Learning Activities

<p>DT</p> <p>Using unwanted socks and the help of an adult, make a puppet family from your favourite traditional tale</p> 	<p>Computing</p> <p>Paint – Drawing on the computer</p>  <p>Draw a picture of your favourite traditional tale.</p> <p>Add as much detail as you can using different colours and different tools. Add some labels for the important characters, such as their name or their favourite spoken words.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>Find out about a special story from a religion of your choice.
