Fiftyseven Year 6 children and six members of staff went to PGL, an activity based centre in Swindon. The children were split into groups and had to work together as a team to complete a range of challenges. They also took part in a variety of fun activities such as abseiling, zip-wire, raft building, rock climbing and archery. Every night the children took part in whole group activities, such as campfire and a disco. The facilities were modern, with every room having their own ensuite bathroom. The children especially enjoyed the food with halal, meat and vegetarian options for breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Year 6 Animation Workshops

he children in year 6 who did not go on school journey took part in an animation project based on their World War 2 studies. They wrote a story about a group of school children who are evacuated to the countryside and who embark on an adventure which involves meeting King George V of England. The children explored various art tech-

niques, including painting, collage and model making. They recorded all the voiceovers, learning basic microphone techniques. They also learned

Black History Month

During Black History Month in year 2, children learned about the lives of Marry Seacole and Florence Nightingale. Mary Seacole was a Jamaican woman Ms Nisha Parmar (Assistant Head) who nursed sick and wounded British soldiers in the Crimean war. The soldiers called her 'Mother Seacole'. Like Florence Nightingale she was determined to look after the soldiers. She was singleminded and even without the help of others she showed that she could be a strong guardian for the soldiers, just as Florence Nightingale was.

During class time pupils also learned about Harriet Tubman and the lives of slaves. They discovered how slaves lived and were treated and talked about the

rights of everyone to be respected equally and treated with kindness and care. They enjoyed learning about freedom quilts and creating their own.



Online Safety: This term in ICT, we have been speaking to the children about Online Safety and going over the rules of how to stay safe on the Internet. We regularly remind children of the rules and what to do if they feel unsafe and it is good to see that the children are always aware.
